THE LIONBERGER FAMILY

1735 emmigrated from Swiss Anabaptist community

Barly Lionbergers are believed to be Mennonite Anabaptists

believing that the only true baptism is that of faith, not dunking of infant in water by a minister

> Their Swiss residence was in the valley of thomme River between Burgdorf and Langnau Leuenbergers are numerous in this area since 1500.

The family name is first found in the records of Burgdorf as early as 1257 according to papers given by Basil, Switzerland in 1950s

Travelled on the billinder called "Oliver". run by master Samuel Merchant of South Carolina with 18 "switzers" and their families totalling 45 immigrants Originating in Rotterdam Netherlands. Registered in Philidelphia Aug. 26th, 1735

"John"= Anglo name for Hans (Johannes)
